I write to invite you to a Public Information Event in relation to proposals for improvements to the school. The purpose of this information event is twofold. Firstly, it is to give the community an opportunity to comment upon the draft scheme prior to the submission of a formal planning application. Secondly, it is to ensure that the local community has prior knowledge of the proposal before submission of a planning application.

Thomas Keble School is a secondary school with the campus buildings located to the south of Bracelands, within the defined settlement of Eastcombe. The built form is located within the north-western part of the site, with the remainder being open fields. The site is within the Cotswolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The proposal will include the erection of a new build block, followed by demolition of the main school building, alterations to the existing sports hall and entrance, new landscaping features incorporating new tree planting, including new dedicated play areas, the reconfiguration of the bus/car park, the provision of sustainability measures. An indicative landscape masterplan for the proposed development is shown overleaf.
