# Mock exams December 2023

# <u>Art</u>

The mock exam period will be an opportunity to work in exam conditions for 10 hours over a number of sessions. Students are expected to prepare for this by liaising with their teacher, to agree a 10 hour 'to do list' (recorded at the back of their sketchbooks). Homeworks set prior to the exam will be assessed as part of the exam period. This will usually be to develop a personalised outcome from a previous topic. In some cases, this may allow time to refine existing sketchbook developments. The mock result will give an indication of the coursework current grade. **Coursework is 60% of the course.** 

# <u>Citizenship</u>

The mock exams for Year 11 (examining 70% of the total course) will include all of the Year 10 studies and the topics covered in Year 11 prior to starting the Citizen Action campaign. They will also include their Citizen Action activity from Year 11.

- Paper 1 (multiple choice): 50 mins
- Paper 2 (short and long answer): 1 hour 45 mins

# <u>Drama</u>

Students will sit a modified version of Component 1: Understanding Drama paper. This will include:

- Section 1: Theatre Roles and Terminology
- Section 2: Study of Set Play (Blood Brothers)

The paper will last 1 hour and will account for **25% of the course**.

DT: Timbers (Resistant Materials) (Edexcel Pearson)

- Component 1: Timbers (1 hour 45 minutes); 50% of the total course
- The exam will be in the same format as a standard exam, focusing on 4 core questions and 4 timber questions.
- Topics covered include all units of study from Year 10: Material Function including properties, Technical Drawing, Stock Materials/ Standard sizes, Life Cycle Assessment (LCA), Social Issues, Timbers, Quality Controls, and Maths skills including area, volume, ratio's percentages.

# English Language:

# Paper 2: Writers' Viewpoints and Perspectives: Exam: 1 hr 45 mins (50% of the total course)

- Section A: Reading one non-fiction text and one literary non-fiction text: 4 questions
- Section B: Writing Viewpoint writing: 1 question

# English Literature:

# Paper 1: Shakespeare and 19<sup>th</sup> Century Novel: 1 hr 45 mins (40% of the total course)

There will be a focus on character for both questions.

- Section A: Shakespeare *Macbeth*: 1 question based on an extract. Students will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play as a whole.
- Section B: A Christmas Carol : 1 question based on an extract. Students will be required to write in detail about an extract from the text and then to write about the text as a whole.

# Food Preparation & Nutrition (Eduqas)

- Component 1: Principles of Food Preparation and Nutrition (1 hour 45 minutes); **50% of the total course**
- The exam will have the same breadth and format as a standard exam.

• Topics covered include all units of study from Year 10: Hygiene & Safety, Healthy Eating & Nutrition, Special Diets, Commodities & Food Science, Cooking Methods, The Food Industry and The Environment.

# French and Spanish

Students will sit 4 exams: listening, speaking, reading and writing at either Foundation or Higher Tier. These are full exams which constitute **100% of the whole GCSE Course.** 

Students are preparing responses to the General Conversation questions on themes 1 and 2 for the speaking exams which will be take place in November. Guidance on the topics has been given.

# <u>Geography</u>

- Paper 1: The Living World, Natural Hazards, Rivers and Coasts. 1 hour and 30 minutes
- Paper 2: Urban Challenges (Lagos and London), Fieldwork Skills (Swanage and Gloucester), Challenge of Resource management. 1 hour
  Both exams together will cover 2/3 of the entire course.

## <u>History</u>

- Paper 1: The Norman Conquest and The People's Health (1 hour and 45 minutes)
- Paper 2: The People's Health (1 hour)

This represents **60% of the final course**. In Year 11 we will study the final two components: The Making of America and Living Under Nazi Rule.

#### <u>Imedia</u>

Paper R093: Creative iMedia in the media industry: 1 hr 30 mins (25% of the total course) Understand sectors, products and job roles that form the media industry; Understand the legal and ethical issues to be considered; Understand the processes used to plan and create digital media products; Understand how media codes are used; Understand the creation of media products to convey meaning, create impact and engage audiences; Understand that the same product can be used by different sectors.

#### Maths

- 3 papers (100% of the total course) each 1.5 hours. Paper 1 is non-calculator, Papers 2 and 3 are calculator.
- Any topics can come up on any paper, but some topics are more suited to non-calculator or calculator questions your teacher will give you more guidance on this.
- You will sit either a foundation tier or higher tier paper your teacher will tell you which you are entered for.

#### <u>Music</u>

Students will sit a modified version of the Appraising paper consisting of Section A only. This will include:

 Section A (unfamiliar listening): 8 questions focusing on the areas of study. Western Classical Tradition (1650-1910), Western Classical Tradition Since 1910, Traditional Music and Popular Music.

The paper will last 1 hour and will account for **30% of the course**.

# 2 Papers: 1 hr 15 min each 60% of total grade:

<u>Paper 1:</u> Health & Fitness, Components of Fitness, Fitness Testing, Training Methods, Principles of Training, Training Zones, Effects Of Exercise, Seasonal Training, Aerobic & Anaerobic Exercise,

Skeletal System, Muscular System, Circulatory And Respiratory Systems, Use of Data, Warm-Up And Cool Down, Levers and Planes and Axis in sport.

**Paper 2:** Health and Well-being, Sedentary lifestyle, Obesity, Somatotypes, Nutrition in sport, Use of Data, Sport Psychology (Skill Acquisition, Goal Setting, Information Processing, SMART Targets, Guidance methods, Arousal levels in sport, Motivation in sport, Personality types, Aggression in sport, Stress Management techniques).

## RE: Year 11 Full Course:

Issues of Human Rights, Christian Beliefs and Islam Beliefs in preparation for a 90 minute mock exam (38% of the total course).

## Triple Science (Set 1a)

Three exams; Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

All exams cover Paper 1 content **(50% of the total course)** which is the same the year 10 exams. All exams will be 1hr 45mins.
