

Year 9 Citizenship Exam

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?

1 paper - 50 minutes

- Yr9 content (10 multiple choice questions, 7 short answer questions, 4 source based questions and a mini essay question)
- Yr8 recap content (6 multiple choice questions)
- Yr7 recap content (2 multiple choice questions)

What topics will I need to revise? – You will receive revision sheets with a reminder of these topics.

Yr9 content:

- The ways countries are governed including the positive and negative elements of dictatorships, oligarchies, democracies, monarchies, military rule and theocracies.
- What is meant by voting in General Elections, who can and cannot vote, how you might become MP or PM of the Government and what is the role of the Houses of Parliament.
- What the Conservative and Labour Parties stand for and who they look to represent.
- The type of advice on how to be a leader given by Niccolo Machiavelli, the medieval Italian diplomat who wrote 'The Prince' in 1513.

Yr8 recap content:

- The way a Youth Magistrate Court is laid out and who would sit around the table.
- That the Youth Magistrate Court would deal with young people aged 10-18 in England and Wales, for minor offences.
- That the Crown Court would try more serious crimes where a custodial sentence (jail) may be an outcome, as part of Criminal law.

Yr7 recap content:

- The United Nations Declaration of Human Rights 1948 and the Rights of the Child 1990.
- Recognise our Human Rights.

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?


A word document printed on the screens. Students will submit a Word document on Teams. The exam will have both Computer Science and iMedia content. They will have 45 – 50 minutes.

Year 9 Geography Exam

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?

A 50-minute exam with a mixture of multiple choice, short answer (1-4 marks), and longer answer (6 marks) questions.

What topics will I need to revise?

- **Impacts of extreme weather** – The location and effects of tornadoes.
- **Glaciation**
What are the processes of erosion?
How glaciated landscapes are formed? Opportunities in glaciated/upland landscapes.
- **Complete a climate graph** and describe the data. How is temperature shown on a climate graph? How is precipitation shown on a climate graph?
- **Climate Change** – Human causes of climate change and The Enhanced Greenhouse Effect.


