Year 11 Updates – Term 3 to 6

Mock Exam Results

Year 11 students received their mock exam results last Tuesday, together with an assembly and initial evaluation tutor-led session to help them digest the outcomes and next steps – you will receive a copy of your child's results as follow-up to this letter, for your information. Please note the final column which indicates the proportion of each course examined in the mocks.

These mock exams represent a very important step in the Year 11 journey, in preparation for the final exams in the summer. Students have experienced important elements of a full 'exam season', with two exams on one day, under statutory conditions. They have developed better revision strategies and study habits and should now have a better grasp of which methods work best for them. It is crucial your child now takes the time to fully reflect on their performance in these mocks. They will receive specific feedback from their subject teachers and, within tutorial sessions, they will complete a thorough evaluation process giving them the skill-set to reflect and identify topic and skills-based areas they will need to prioritise to enable progress to be made over the coming months. We will continue to support students with academic, well-being and pastoral support through assemblies and wider care, and the enrichment programme, that currently offers Science and Maths sessions, will develop further to include other subject areas in terms 4 and 5.

Key Events and support over next few terms:

Science and Maths enrichment

On Mondays, after school, the Science department is running Y11 support sessions, as are Maths on a Tuesday and Wednesday. Both will be running throughout terms 3, 4, and 5.

RSE (Relationships and Sex Education) - During tutor time over the next two terms, each tutor group will be attending a workshop delivered by a member of staff from the Holly Gazzard Trust. As many of you may know the trust was created following the murder of 20-year-old Holly Gazzard in 2014 by an ex-partner.

The 60–90-minute workshop covers all elements of Coercive Control and the course aims to help students identify when this is happening, the importance of early intervention and what action can be taken. Further information can be found via the following link: <u>https://holliegazzard.org/</u>

We are holding an end of Year 11 celebration evening on the 27th June, 6.30pm-8pm. This will be held in the hall and attendance will be through parental invite. The evening provides a fantastic opportunity to celebrate our student's performance across all subjects throughout the year.

Year 11 Prom

This is on the 4th July at Stonehouse Court hotel. The school gateway has now closed for the prom with a fantastic number of students wanting to attend. Arrival begins for 6.30pm and the prom finishes at 11.15pm.

Attendance matters

On a separate note, and a final push with Year 11, it is worth re-stating the obvious yet important point about the clear correlation between student progress and excellent attendance. In fact, national statistics show an attendance of at least 95% is required to produce a likelihood of students making at least expected progress. Students with an average attendance of 90-92% achieved over a third of a grade less than would have been expected. Your child's Y11 attendance to date is included on the mock results document, for your information. Please do all you can to ensure they are consistently in school.

We hope the wide range of support and advice in place for our students leads to them feeling prepared, engaged and motivated, through the coming months.
