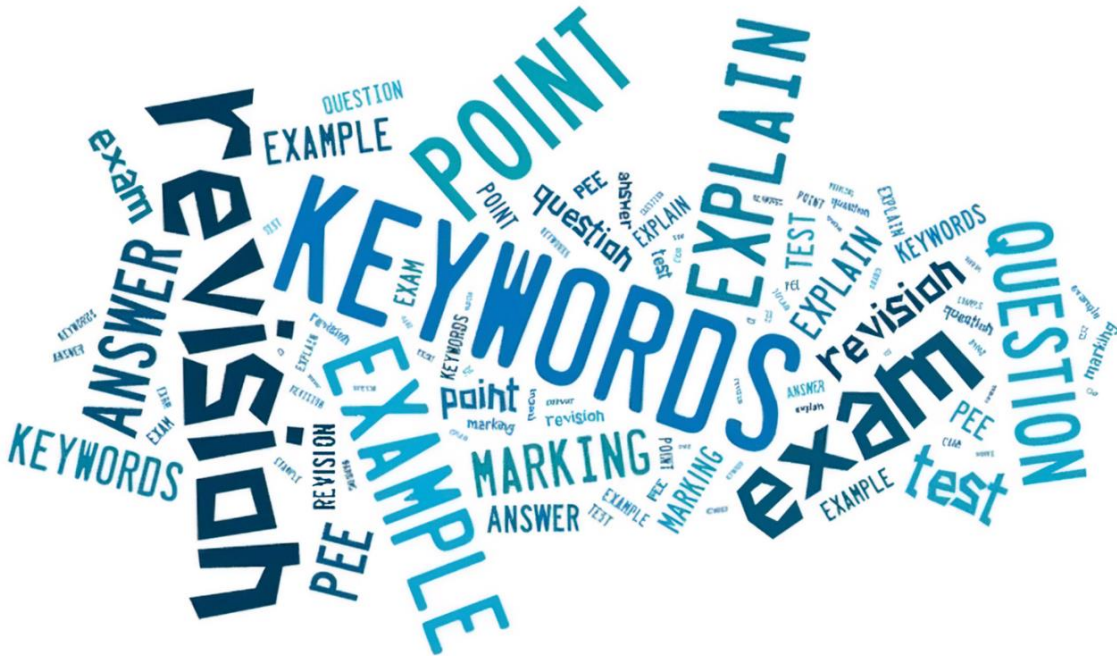

Year 7 Citizenship Exam

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?

Your exam will be written and will last 50 minutes.

It will have 6 multiple choice questions, 7 short answer questions, 4 source based short answer questions and 2 mini essay questions, worth 8 marks each.

What topics will I need to revise?

- What the school subject Citizenship is about – politics and law
- What the word 'citizen' means, that the Ancient Romans used it initially and how that can link to being proud of your home nation.
- Two important documents on Human Rights – The United Nations Declaration of Human Rights (1948) and the United Nations Rights of the Child (1990) and some understanding of what these documents say.
- The work of pro -Human Rights organisations such as Amnesty International.
- What an asylum seeker or Refugee is.
- What an immigrant is.
- The possible positive / negative effects of encouraging lots of immigrants into the UK.
- What you did for your Citizen Action campaign to encourage people at home to change their behaviour to protect the environment. And how your Action could then encourage people to try and make their government introduce changes. Know the kinds of legal action people can take to make their Government consider the changes they want them to make.

What topics will I need to revise?

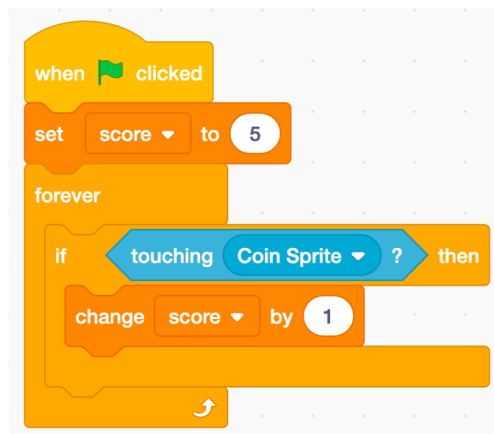

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?

One exam with two sections: Reading and Writing

Timing: One Lesson: 30 minutes on section A, 30 minutes on Section B

Year 7 French Exam

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?

A short speaking test

- Reading (25 minutes)
- Listening (25 minutes)
- Writing (45 minutes)

What topics will I need to revise?

Year 7 – Numbers for age, birthday, dates and time, classroom equipment, family members and pets, descriptions and personality, adjectives and agreements, school subjects and opinions, clothes, colours and uniform, school routine and ER verb patterns.

Year 7 Geography Exam

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?

A 50-minute exam with a mixture of multiple choice, short answer (1-4 marks), and longer answer (6 marks) questions.

What topics will I need to revise?

OS map skills – Be able to complete 4 figure and 6 figure grid references. Be able to identify OS map symbols.

Resources – Suggest reasons for water shortages in Las Vegas and methods to reduce the problem.

Geology – Identify rock types and explain the formation of limestone rocks

Tourism in Limestone landscapes – Identify causes of conflict at Cheddar Gorge or the Peak District.

Useful revision resources and specific revision tasks:

You will have a revision lesson with your Geography teacher before the test with specific quiz questions to support retention of knowledge. You will be given a **revision clock** to help you organise your independent study.

Year 7 History Exam

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?

A one lesson exam that will look at knowledge, understanding and the use of sources. You will have short knowledge questions, longer summary and explanation questions and then more extended source-based questions that look at inference and comparison. The final question will be an extended answer that asks for your opinion.

What topics will I need to revise

Everyone will revise:

- Was life in Ancient Rome brutal or civilised?
- How different were the Vikings and the Anglo-Saxons?
- How did William gain and maintain control of England?

You will also need to revise whichever of these subjects you have studied:

- Was the Black Death a turning point in the Medieval World?
- How and Why did Castles develop?
- Was there a winner in the Crusades?

Useful revision resources and specific revision tasks:

A revision clock, a terminology task and a mind map task will be done in class.

What will the exam look like (timings / format)?

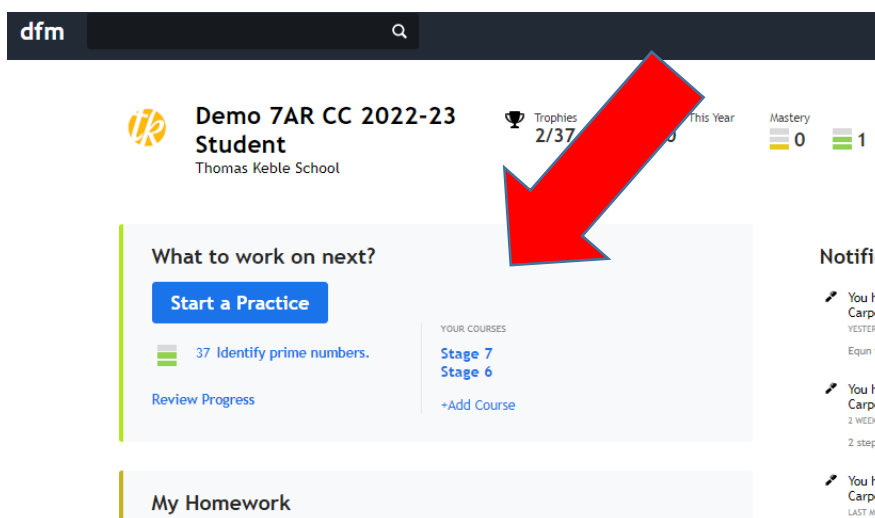
The exam will take place in 2 of your Maths lessons. All groups will get two papers.

What topics will I need to revise?

What topics will I need to revise?

- Meditation

Truth:

- The myth of Daedalus and Icarus
- Philosophers views on truth

Jesus:

- Birth
- Discipleship
- Miracles
- Parables
